Like few others, Sterling was formed in 1999 by a group of creative activists and authors who wanted to create the kind of place that could offer the potential for great projects and a collaborative environment of people who were interested in creating. They came together around a shared drive to put a movie studio in Kansas on the map. The 16-acre site was purchased and a \$21 million dollar studio was built. The first project there was "Murder By Numbers," which has made its way to festivals and award shows at this point. A second project, "RoboCop," went on to go on to garner rave reviews for the year and is also now in festivals and award shows. "RoboCop" was by far one of the biggest movies we've ever done," said Jon Cohen, director of Sterling Studios, "but I don't think that it's the most important. I think that most of the important projects I've been associated with have not been very big. It's just one of the things you have to do." Cohen grew up in Kansas and upon returning to the state started to examine the small towns that were around him. The small towns that he felt had no legacy, that hadn't been resurrected in a significant way. "There are places in Kansas that are dying," he said. "They have a huge tractor store, or a donut shop and that's about it. It's really strange. All
